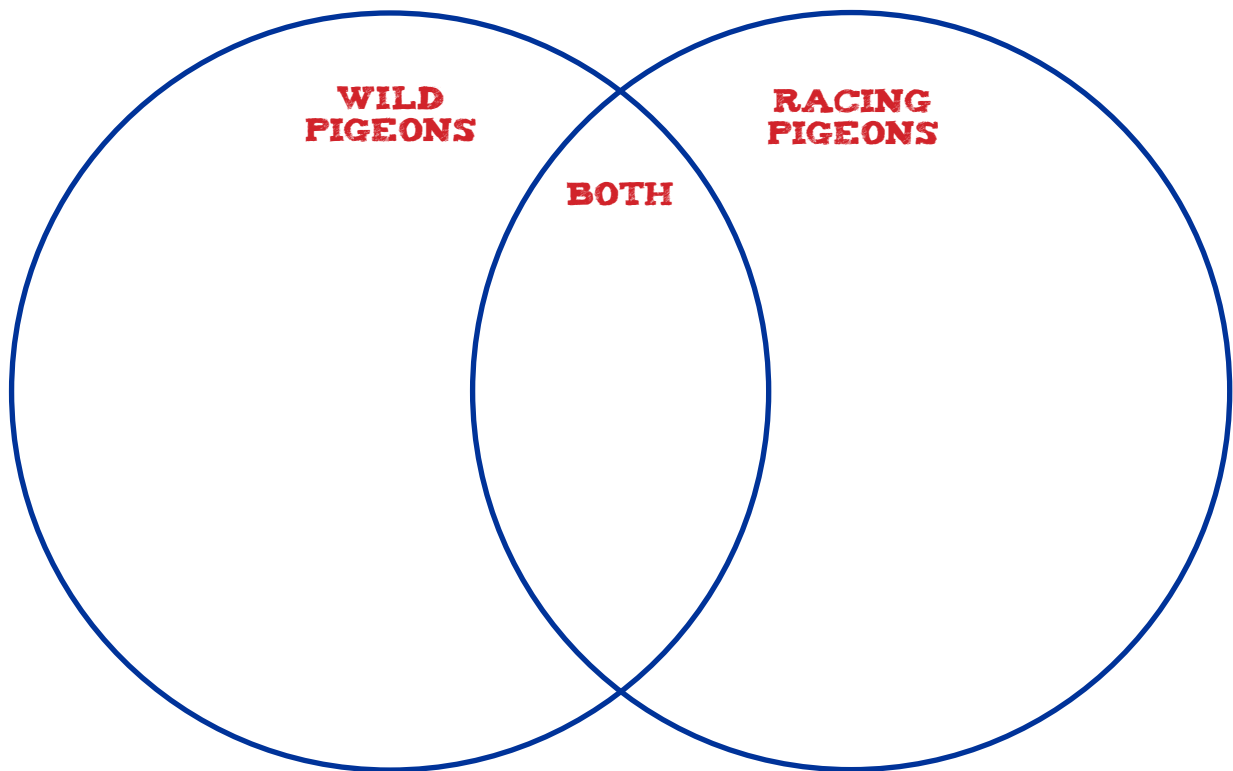


COACH QUILL SAYS:
